Thus in a sense – the physical sense – the community does not utilize its great men until they are already past their prime, but in another sense – the social sense – it utilizes them at the peak of their greatness.

5. Read the following passage and answer the questions that follow :

In 1915, a wealthy man named Lord Carnarvon employed archaeologist Howard Carter to look for a royal tomb in the Valley of the Kings. Nothing of importance was found until November 1922, when Carter's workers cleared some huts away and found steps leading underground to a sealed door inscribed with the name of the Pharaoh Tutankhamun. Grave-robbers had discovered this cunningly hidden tomb in antiquity but they had not been able to carry anything away; so, when the door to the tomb was opened, after around 3000 years, a splendid collection of treasures was found, alongside food and wine and other everyday objects for the Afterlife.

- (a) Describe the events leading up to the discovery of King Tutankhamun's tomb.
- (b) When was the door to the tomb opened and what came to light?
- (c) Convert 'wealthy' into a noun.
- (d) Convert 'importance' into an adjective.
- (e) What is the antonym or opposite of 'hidden'?
- (f) Give the verb form of 'collection' and make a sentence with it.
