- 5. Whom does Lady Macbeth frame for the murder of Duncan?
- 6. Whom does Macbeth see sitting in his chair during the banquet?

- 8. How does Birnam Wood come to Dunsinane?

- 5. Analyze in detail the 'Banquet Scene' in Macbeth and add a critical comment.
- 6. Discuss the dramatic importance of Act 1 Scene 1in 'Twelfth Night'.
- 7. Analyse the letter that Maria writes to Malvolio and bring out Maria's art of deceiving Malvolio.
- 8. Explain the significance of the Epilogue in As You Like It?
- 9. Analyse the famous speech by Jaques "All the world's a stage, and all the men and women merely players".
